### From the Pastor...

I love the Psalms - they have survived centuries and still resonate with us today. Jesus quoted them, and they are some of the only scripture passages from the Bible that if you start a verse, others can almost automatically finish the verse. For instance with Psalm 23 - if I say, "The Lord is my shepherd..." you might automatically think, "I shall not want."

Why have the Psalms survived, and why do they still appeal to us the way they do? I think the Psalms still resonate with us today because their words are directed to God. They aren't words about God - they aren't the long histories of kings and queens and battles, or the stories of who married who and what the names of their children were, and what they did to get in trouble or what they did to please God. The Psalms aren't teachings like the ones that were attributed to Jesus in the Gospels, that tell us how to live. The Psalms are unique in that they are words that are directed to God. They are the prayers and appeals of people to God. And in these prayers and appeals to God, the Psalms touch on a variety of human experiences.

There's something for everyone in the Book of Psalms. If you're having a good day and you want to give thanks to God but feel awkward coming up with your own words for how to do it - you can find a Psalm that gives thanks. Angry and wanting revenge against someone at work or the person in the car who cut you off while driving here? You can find a Psalm requesting God's wrath come to your "enemy." Filled with grief and sadness? There's a Psalm for that, too. In fact, there are more Psalms of lament than any other kind of Psalm you'll find in the whole collection.

After leading virtual worship with you during the early days of the pandemic, I look forward to meeting and worshiping with you in person this month!

gifts for the children of families in need. Bea Z. has agreed to coordinate this drive, now in its 26<sup>th</sup> year.


